



DRIVE IN (LAC SEUL)
GPS N50-34-803; W093-10-032

Lac Seul is a crescent-shaped reservoir approximately 150 miles long, first flooded in 1935. It is the second-largest body of water entirely within the province of Ontario. The lake consists of open water, bays, narrow channels and islands. It is a relatively shallow lake with many rocky shoals. This provides good habitat for wall-eye and northern pike.

Lac Seul is noted for the remote wilderness character it offers as well as some of the best fishing in Ontario. Other fish species found in Lac Seul are muskie, yellow perch, white fish and the occasional rock bass. Lac Seul is located on the former lake bed of glacial Lake Agassiz. Due to this previous lake, much of the bottom of the lakes is covered in thick deposits of lacustrine silts and varved clay of varying thickness. The water of Lac Seul is tea coloured. In clear water, walleye only feed at dusk and dawn because of their light-sensitive eyes, but because of the tea colour of Lac Seul, it provides excellent walleye and northern pike angling opportunities throughout the day.

Lac Seul appreciates some of the finest trophy northern pike and walleye, yet provides the feeling of the vast, practically untouched wilderness.

TRAVEL

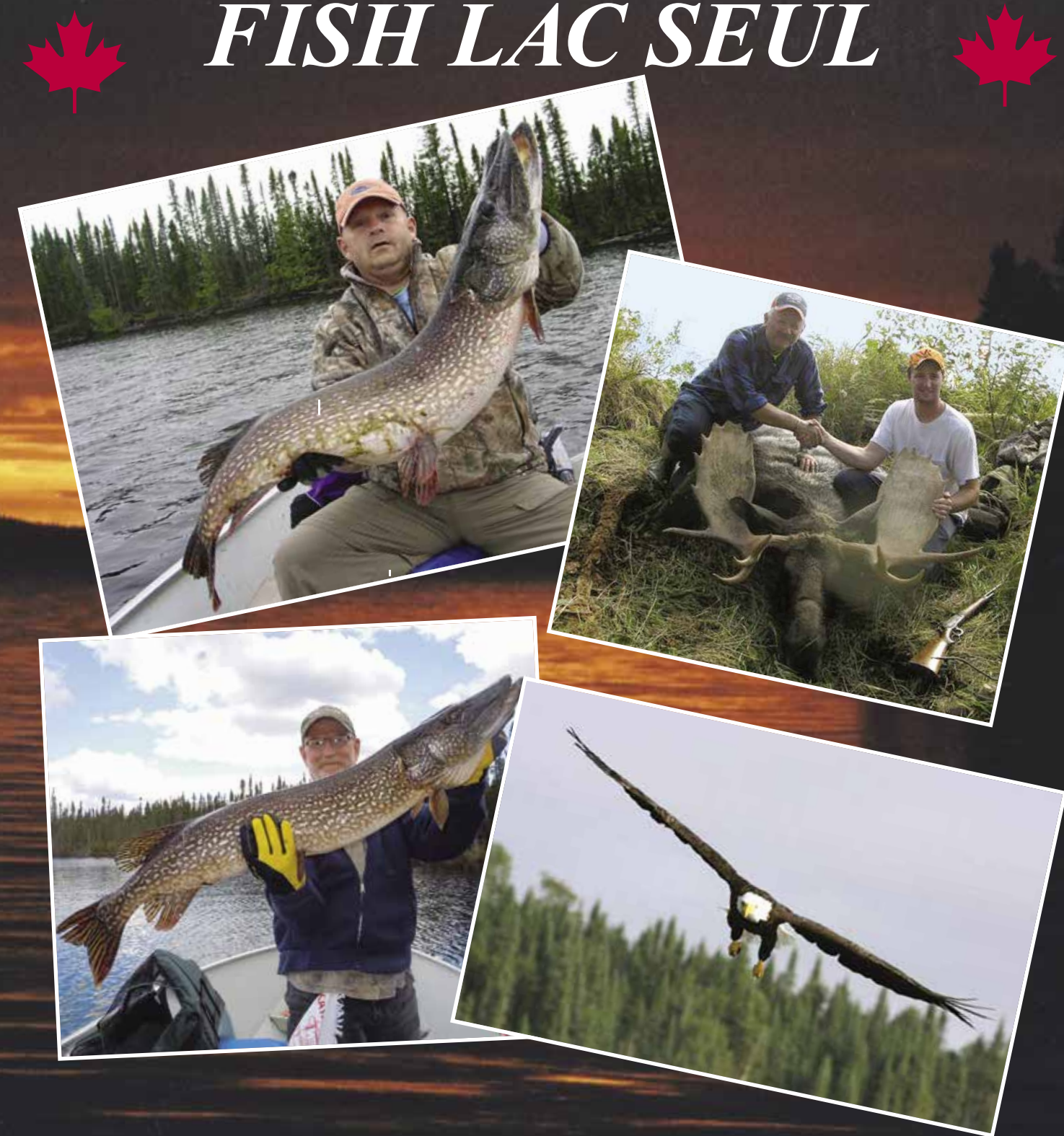
BY CAR: If arriving by car, you will have no problem getting gasoline or diesel products. Most suppliers will take credit cards or U.S. dollars. The drive from International Falls/Fort Frances (on the Minnesota-Ontario border) to KayAir will take about 4 hours to drive.

FLY & DRIVE: Major airport destinations to consider are Kenora (Ontario, Canada), Winnipeg (Manitoba, Canada), or Duluth (Minnesota). Each airport has car rentals available. Driving time is about 4 hours from International Falls and Winnipeg; Kenora is 2 hours; and Duluth is 6 hours. To fly the entire trip, the recommended route is from Winnipeg to Red Lake then charter KayAir Service Inc., to meet you. For information on airline travel, contact Red Lake Travel at 1-800-465-3305. Birch Lake Outpost

West Cabin - 8 Man
4 Boats & Motors East Cabin - 8 Man

Birch Lake is located 70 air miles North East of our base and is approximately 30,000 acres. It is over 20 miles long, but is broken up by hundreds of islands and bays. Nature has provided this lake with an abundance of weed beds, reefs and rivers where excellent walleye, northern and lake trout fishing can be found throughout the ENTIRE season. We have built two cabins that are located in a sheltered bay on the North East shore. The cabins are 100' apart and have their own separate docks. Both cabins are equipped with 12' x 12' covered decks, solar lighting, hot and cold running water - indoor showers and 2 fridges, 2 bedrooms (4 people in each) have 6" inner spring mattresses on bunks. A large BBQ and fish cooker on the deck ensure your steak and fish fries are a success every time. Add 14.5 deep Alumarine boats with swivel seats and 15 h.p. motors and you have a great holiday lined up. A shed at the dock holds all the gas needed for your boats, along with cushions, paddles, and minnow buckets. A screened-in fish cleaning house with running water will make the job of preparing your supper more enjoyable. Walkways to the cabins, docks and fish cleaning house are an added luxury. If you have a big party or just like lots of room to explore, then you will enjoy Birch Lake.



Casummit Lake Outpost

8 Man Cabin - 4 Boats & Motors

Casummit Lake is located 72 miles North East of our base. The fully equipped cabin is the only outpost on the lake, for your privacy. Lake depths of up to 35' with lots of structure and weed beds provide excellent walleye and northern fishing. A short walk (15 minutes) and you are in Jonestone Lake. There you will find 2 boats and motors and all the gas you need. Once on the lake you will be in for some of the best fishing in North-western Ontario. Walleye fishing is fast and furious with large northern to top it all off. A nicer setting for a cabin would be hard to find and if you like being the only people on the lake, Casummit Lake is for you.



Saddle Lake Outpost

6 Man Cabin - 3 Boats & Motors

Saddle Lake is located 104 air miles North East of our base, a flight of about 50 minutes. Saddle Lake is approximately 5 miles by 2 miles. With depths of 35 feet dark water and lots of structure, walleye and northern fishing will be excellent. A cabin built with you, the fisherman in mind, 14.5 Deep Alumarine boats with 8 HP motors and high back swivel seats ensure your comfort and safety. Hot and cold running water, indoor shower, solar lighting, and walkways to the dock, boat ramps, privy and fish cleaning house are all an added luxury. A 12' x 12' covered deck with a gas BBQ fish cooker and 120 qt. cooler for your beer and pop make your fish and steak fries a success each and every time. A shed at the lake has all the gas, minnow buckets, paddles and cushions needed for your stay. A screened-in fish cleaning house complete with running water makes this one of the nicest and well equipped outposts in Northwestern Ontario. Saddle Lake is a conservation lake. We ask that NO TROPHY fish be taken out. If you weigh, measure and take a picture of the fish to a taxidermist they can make you a replica mount of equal or better quality. A lake map with some of the hot spots marked on it will be given to all our guests before their departure. If you want your own private lake with unspoiled fishing and 1st class accommodations then Saddle Lake is the place for you.
